Preliminary Hebrew / Basic Hebrew Level 1 (one semester)

- No prerequisites
- Learn all the Hebrew letters and vowels of the aleph-bet
 - learn how to read and pronounce Hebrew words
 - great opportunity to start learning to read Hebrew
 - learn preliminary vocabulary (Preliminary Hebrew only)
- Text: Teach Yourself to Read Hebrew, EKS Publishing + additional handouts

Basic Hebrew Level 2 (two semesters)

- Prerequisite: equivalent of Preliminary Hebrew: know the aleph-bet and how to pronounce Hebrew words
- Course is similar to what religious school students learn in 3rd+4th grades at TBI Religious School
 - students must already know the Aleph-Bet and how to pronounce simple words
 - students are not required to have any vocabulary knowledge
 - great opportunity to start learning to read and understand simple stories
 - depending upon student capabilities, course may be taught over one or two semesters

Basic Hebrew Level 3 (two semesters)

- Prerequisite: equivalent of Basic Hebrew Level 2: know the aleph-bet and how to pronounce Hebrew words
- Course is similar to what religious school students learn in 5th+6th grades at TBI Religious School
 - students must already know how to read simple sentences
 - students are expected to know the vocabulary taught in Basic Hebrew Level 2
 - great opportunity to start learning to read and understand simple stories
 - depending upon student capabilities, course may be taught over one or two semesters

 - depending upon student capabilities, course may be taught over one or two semesters

- Learn a 190 word vocabulary
- Hebrew language concepts covered:
 - Review concepts covered (first class day - prior to registration):
 - proper consonant & vowel pronunciations
 - Subject pronouns (I, we, he, etc.)
 - Present tense verbs & active Hebrew participle (is writing, is saying, is making, etc.)

- Male & female nouns & adjectives
- Writing in Hebrew script
- Basic vocabulary review
- New concepts covered:
 - Past tense verbs (Hebrew perfect)
 - Object Pronouns (me, us, him, etc.)
 - Irregular plural nouns & adjectives
 - Passive Hebrew participle (is written, is said, is made, etc.)
- Practice reading and pronouncing words and sentences with proper inflection
- Read simple stories with simple vocabularies
- Approximately 20 minutes homework assigned per class session

Intermediate Hebrew Levels 5-7 (two semesters each)

- Prerequisite: equivalent of Basic Hebrew Level 4; know how to read & write Hebrew script; know present tense & past tense verb forms; know pronouns, possessive endings
- Course is similar to what religious school students learn in 7th+8th grades
 - any younger student wishing to get ahead or review this level Hebrew is welcome
 - questions about prerequisites: please contact Gary Raymond to discuss
 - great opportunity for "rusty" parent and student to do Hebrew course together
 - depending upon student capabilities, course may be taught over one or two semesters

- Practice writing in Hebrew script
- Learn a 300 word vocabulary
- Hebrew language concepts covered:
 - Seven verb Binyanim - including a variety of common Gizrot for each Binyan
 - Present, Past, and Future conjugations
 - Expressing Commands/Requests - Imperative, Future 2nd Person, Infinitive
 - Hebrew Infinitives and related grammar rules.
 - Past Continuing/Repeated actions
 - Transitive vs Intransitive verbs and their inflections
 - Numbers: Cardinal, Ordinal, Absolute, Construct, Gender
 - Colors
 - Syllable stress, Segolates, Double Patakh, Furtive Patakh, Shva+Khataf vowels
 - Declension of nouns (adding pronominal suffixes to nouns).
 - Direct versus Indirect objects
 - Adjectives - rules for both attributive adjectives and predicate adjectives
 - Construct state and associated rules.
 - Participles (verbal adjectives) - including standard inflections for Binyan Pa'al verbs
 - Gerunds (verbal nouns)
 - Hebrew word prefixes, their meanings and declensions
 - Prepositions, their meanings and declensions
 - Locative Hei suffix
 - Hebrew question syntax
 - Vav-Conjunctive
 - Vav-Inversive
 - Definite Direct Object Particle Et
 - Expressing Possession in present, past, and future tenses
 - Using a Hebrew dictionary - including differences between classic and modern Hebrew spelling
- Practice reading and writing sentences
- Read second level stories with simple vocabularies
- Approximately 20 minutes homework assigned per class session

Intermediate Hebrew Levels 8-9 (two semesters each)

- Prerequisite: equivalent of Intermediate Hebrew Level 7; ability to read short Hebrew stories and engage in basic Hebrew conversations
- Course uses text books, dictionaries, handouts, internet links and teacher directed conversation to engage students in a Hebrew and Jewish Life learning experience. Emphasis on exploring Hebrew, not only as a language, but as a basis for ethics and Jewish tradition.
- Text: To be determined, based upon student skills
- Class is conducted in Hebrew and homework assignments are given in Hebrew. Other than text books, most handouts do not use nikkud (Hebrew vowels).
